As generative AI becomes more integrated into business operations, courts are increasingly recognizing AI inputs and outputs as discoverable evidence. Are you prepared?

I'm Kelley Halliburton, and this is a *Must Know Minute*.

When your team uses generative AI tools like ChatGPT, Copilot, or internal AI systems, they're creating two categories of potentially discoverable information: the inputs, including prompts, uploaded documents, and instructions, and the outputs or responses generated by the system.

A single project manager might have dozens of AI interactions per day. Multiply that across your team over months or years, and you've greatly expanded the universe of data subject to preservation obligations.

Once litigation is reasonably anticipated, the volume of potentially discoverable, AI-related ESI can dwarf traditional email and document collections.

Responsible integration of AI isn't only an IT issue, it's a discovery issue. Implementing AI governance policies and training employees on the litigation implications of AI use are practical steps you can take to prepare.
